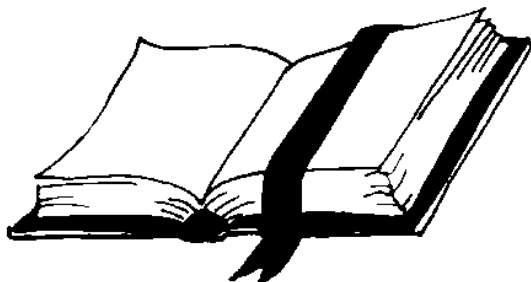

NAMI (Family - To - Family) Free Education Program: Free course offers help for families of mentally ill. The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) of Massachusetts with help from the Mass. Dept. of Mental Health is sponsoring a free educational course on the Vineyard for family members or significant others of individuals with a serious mental illness. There will be twelve weekly Thursday evening classes from 6:30-9:00pm, beginning Thursday, Feb. 18, 2010 and ending on Thursday, May 6th, 2010. The NAMI course, which has been given nationwide to over 100,000 family members and was given last year on the island for the first time to 22 families, is intended to help family caregivers cope with a close relative's mental illness.

The course will cover information about schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, major depression, obsessive-compulsive disorder, anxiety disorders and borderline personality disorder. The classes also cover topics such as coping skills, crisis and relapse, listening and communication techniques, problem solving and limit setting techniques, and the family caregiver's need for self-care.

The course is not open to individuals who themselves suffer from a serious mental illness, unless their condition is stable and they wish to attend as caregivers for close relatives who have a mental illness. The class size is normally limited to 20 people and advance registration is required. Location on the island will be given upon registration. MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS - POPE BENEDICT XVI - FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE - WORLD DAY OF PEACE - 1 JANUARY 2010

IF YOU WANT TO CULTIVATE PEACE, PROTECT CREATION

2. In my Encyclical *Caritas in Veritate*, I noted that integral human development is closely linked to the obligations which flow from *man's relationship with the natural environment*. The environment must be seen as God's gift to all people, and the use we make of it entails a shared responsibility for all humanity, especially the poor and the future generations. I also observed that whenever nature, and human beings in particular, are seen merely as products of chance or an evolutionary determinism, our overall sense of responsibility wanes. On the other hand, seeing creation as God's gift to humanity helps us understand our vocation and worth as human beings. With the Psalmist, we can exclaim with wonder: "When I look at your heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you have established; what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?" (Ps 8:4-5). Contemplating the beauty of creation inspires us to recognize the love of the Creator, that Love which "moves the sun and the other stars".

**Comunidade Católica Brasileira Martha's Vineyard
Quarto Domingo Tempo Comum - 2010**

Na primeira semana de fevereiro a Igreja Católica celebra o dia de São Brás. E como é de nossa tradição católica, temos a Bênção da garganta dentro da celebração da Missa. São Brás é um santo, mártir que ao defender a fé cristã, deixa para nós católicos um exemplo de vida e a certeza de sua intercessão na comunhão dos santos, junto a Deus (Igreja Triunfante). Para conhecer um pouco melhor a vida deste santo vou contar um pouco da sua história: São Brás nasceu no seio de uma família pomposa, de pais nobres; recebeu educação cristã e se consagrou como Bispo quando era ainda muito jovem. Ao começar a perseguição aos cristãos, por inspiração divina, retirou-se a uma cova nas montanhas, frequentada por feras selvagens, às quais o santo atendia e curava quando estavam doentes. São Brás foi um pastor muito querido pelos fiéis enquanto Bispo. Durante o seu cativeiro, na escuridão do calabouço, obteve de presente de algum de seus amigos um par de velas, com as quais recebia luz e calor. Por isso, na representação iconográfica, o santo aparece portando duas candeias. A tradição da "Bênção de São Brás", ou "Bênção das gargantas", que se faz cruzando duas velas sobre as gargantas, se atribui a um milagre que o santo fez em vida, quando curou uma criança que morria engasgada com um osso na garganta. A Missão de São Brás como Bispo de Sebaste e como um homem de Deus que curava e testemunhava sua intensa experiência com o divino, é para nós cristãos católicos, no dia de hoje uma oportunidade para perguntarmos a Deus qual é a nossa Missão, ou seja, é necessário perguntar a Deus em oração: Senhor, o que devo fazer por um mundo melhor, como cristão e como pessoa humana? Cada um de nós, batizados e membros da família de Deus, possuímos um compromisso para com o bem comum de todos e a felicidade do mundo inteiro. Ao recebermos a Bênção de São Brás: "proteção das enfermidades da alma, do corpo inteiro e da garganta", a Igreja Católica se torna uma ponte incessante de Bênçãos e Graças para cada um de nós permanecer com disposição, saúde e motivação na caminhada neste mundo em direção à felicidade perfeita em prol de si mesmo, dos irmãos, da comunidade que pertencemos e do mundo inteiro. Se você se sente cansado, doente, decepcionado com a vida, com depressão ou desanimado... Não perca esta Missa no dia 03 de fevereiro e esteja completamente aberto para receber pelo ministério de Igreja e providência divina que cura, liberta e salva a alma, um milagre especial reservado somente para você. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Atrium

As the children line up and wait to enter into the atrium you can feel the anticipation in the hallway. They might be looking forward to working with a particular material, resuming a work they began last week, or wondering what new material will be presented today. More times than not, they are looking forward to just spending some quiet time in this space that has been created just for them. That is what makes the atrium so special.

Maria Montessori gave the space its name in reference to the space in the oldest churches dedicated to the instruction of the catechumens as they prepared to enter the Catholic Church. Our work assists the children to enter more fully into their faith and traditions, especially the celebration of the liturgy. Upon entering the space it is immediately apparent that this is no ordinary classroom. The main focus in the room is the prayer corner, usually designated by a rug and a low table. It is here where most sessions begin and end, developing and enhancing communal prayer. From there the space is divided into several areas of concentration:

- Practical life – assists in centering one’s attention skills and to educate in the care of the Atrium
- Altar and Liturgy – to name, identify and make accessible the items, vessels and gestures that are used in the celebration of liturgy
- Geography – to lift up and identify the places where Jesus lived and died
- The Infancy Narratives – to lift up the historical nature of the birth of Jesus
- The Parables – to make accessible the images Jesus used to explain the mystery the Kingdom of God
- The Good Shepherd – located in the center of the room, this work invites the child to hear how much the shepherd loves His sheep
- Baptism – to name, identify and to make accessible items and gestures used in the sacrament of Baptism
- The Holy Bible – to identify that the Bible is one book made up of many books and to encourage further study of scripture

There are works in each of these areas – real materials that have been created or purchased by the catechists to engage the children. The catechist introduces these materials to the children while making a presentation and offers suggestions for potential work. During an atrium session a child might contemplate the mystery of the Kingdom of God while looking at a mustard seed or a precious pearl, or by mixing yeast with three measures of flour. While working with clay representations of Mary and Gabriel, they may try to imagine how Mary felt when the Angel told her she was to be the mother of Jesus. By encouraging the children to spend some quiet time, working with the material we are allowing the child’s inner teacher to do the catechizing.

Creating the materials for an atrium is a form of prayer and provides an opportunity for the community of faith to participate in the faith formation of the children. Material Making happens every Wednesday from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm and from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm (except on Prayer Shawl Ministry evenings). There are tasks for all abilities and may include sanding, sewing, painting, laminating, writing, and wood working. Please consider donating some of your time and ability. Stewardship Report: Our Gift of Time~Talent~Treasure

There are hundreds of hours of service given to our Parish by very caring and dedicated parishioners and friends of our Parish. On the report above, you can only see the offerings (*Treasure*) that were made and expenses that were paid for. The giving of *Time* and *Talent*, which helps lessen our expenses, is equally important as our offerings of *Treasure*. These three elements of Stewardship are important for our Parish to thrive spiritually and communally.

The year of 2008, our Net Operating Income was -\$212,058, 2009 was -\$93,286. This loss was offset by interest income of \$98,910. We need to breakeven in 2010 to prepare for the purchase of land, which will eliminate the interest income.

During the 1st quarter of 2009 we used \$100,000 from our "Rainy Day Fund" and we returned it in the 4th quarter of 2009. Our goal was to breakeven for 2009. The needs of our ministries and properties exceeded our offerings. We are positioned well to reduce expenses in the coming year and we may be able to support our Parish with the *Time, Talent and Treasure* needed to bring us to breakeven in 2010.

Highlights for 2009

- We paid \$28,000 for the sound/recording system in OLSOS
- We spent \$60,000 to refurbish St. A's basement and make repairs to drains, windows, foundation and HVAC system
- We spent \$50,000 at the O.B. Rectory, most of which was to repair damage done by termites in the basement
- At the Parish Center, we fixed the ventilation system, fixed the drums on the boiler, replaced a few windows and gave a facelift to our Atriums and did some painting for about \$40,000

We are positioned well, going into 2010, to reduce our expense level. May the combined efforts of all parishioners bring us together to be good stewards of our Parish. Respectfully, Steve Bernier - Business Administrator
