Since the Island is a very popular place for weddings, we need to schedule a date at least a year in advance to avoid being disappointed and then begin the preparation process 8 months in advance. Holy Ground

Third Sunday of Lent

This Sunday offers Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush. The Lord promises Moses that he will lead the captive Israelites out of Egypt and into "a land flowing with milk and honey." **Luke's Gospel** tells us of Jesus' warning that we must be willing to repent now and that our lives could end by accident or through the evil of someone else. The parable of the barren fig tree reminds us of God's patient love for us, even when we show no signs of changing our lives.

Gospel: Luke 13:1-9

Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!"

And he told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.'"

Reflection: In Luke's account of the Gospel, Jesus counters the common belief that suffering is the measure of punishment deserved. Disasters do not invade our lives as divine retribution for sin, yet disasters do remind us of life's frailty and of our need to remain in right relationship with God. The Lord's patience with us, the gift of time, provides opportunities for us to bear good fruit.

While the historical books of the Bible recount God’s creative and redemptive acts in history, the Psalms reveal Israel’s response to God’s covenant offer and serve as a model for our response to Him. Indeed, one could say that the historical books tell the “outside” of the story of Israel by giving an historical perspective, while the Psalms tell the “inside” story, which comes from the deeply personal perspective of one who is seeking God. Our communication with God is enhanced by a deeper understanding of the book of Psalms and of the individual psalms that reside in each of our hearts.

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS - POPE BENEDICT XVI - FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE - WORLD DAY OF PEACE - 1 JANUARY 2010

IF YOU WANT TO CULTIVATE PEACE, PROTECT CREATION

7. Sad to say, it is all too evident that large numbers of people in different countries and areas of our planet are experiencing increased hardship because of the negligence or refusal of many others to exercise responsible stewardship over the environment. The Second Vatican Ecumenical Council reminded us that “God has destined the earth and everything it contains for all peoples and nations”. The goods of creation belong to humanity as a whole. Yet the current pace of environmental exploitation is seriously endangering the supply of certain natural resources not only for the present generation, but above all for generations yet to come. It is not hard to see that environmental degradation is often due to the lack of far-sighted official policies or to the pursuit of myopic economic interests, which then, tragically, become a serious threat to creation. To combat this phenomenon, economic activity needs to consider the fact that “every economic decision has a moral consequence” and thus show increased respect for the environment. When making use of natural resources, we should be concerned for their protection and consider the cost entailed - environmentally and socially - as an essential part of the overall expenses incurred. The international community and national governments are responsible for sending the right signals in order to combat effectively the misuse of the environment. To protect the environment, and to safeguard natural resources and the climate, there is a need to act in accordance with clearly-defined rules, also from the juridical and economic standpoint, while at the same time taking into due account the solidarity we owe to those living in the poorer areas of our world and to future generations.

**Comunidade Catolica Brasileira Martha's Vineyard
Terceiro Domingo Quaresma - 2010**

A reflexão que a Igreja Católica nos oferece nesta terceira semana parte da primeira leitura onde Moises faz uma genuína experiência de Deus na visão da “Sarça ardente”. Esta experiência de Moisés deve ser repetida em cada cristão e sobretudo em cada católico que seriamente se prepara para a Páscoa, nesta quaresma 2010. Ouvir a voz de Deus e colocar-se à disposição do projeto divino é o enfoque da Palavra que encontramos no livro do Êxodo 3,1. Devemos seguir minuciosamente o texto e imitar Moisés que diz SIM a Deus, continuando o seu diálogo propondo uma estrutura para a eficácia deste plano. Precisamos como Moisés estar em oração e contato com um Deus que ouve o clamor do seu povo, entende as dificuldades do dia-a-dia do ser humano e se compadece carinhosamente de suas aflições. Deus é a ajuda que vem do alto, a resposta de nossos questionamentos e a força que necessitamos para não desanimar em nossa caminhada. Em nossas orações neste período de Quaresma, é importante ouvir a promessa de Deus que sugere o fim de nossas tristezas, desânimos e preocupações, oferecendo-nos como ao povo de Israel uma “terra onde corre leite e mel” representado uma nova realidade de alegria e felicidades. Devemos permanecer em um diálogo saudável com Deus: Aquele que pode suscitar situações e pessoas para ser uma luz onde existindo apenas trevas não é possível enxergar nada. Deus suscitou Moisés, do meio do deserto para ser uma luz para um povo sofrido que jamais desanimou de pedir, implorar ou colocar na misericórdia divina suas necessidades. Como Católicos piedosos que somos, precisamos nesta terceira semana da quaresma apoiar-nos cada vez mais em nossas orações como sustento e base em Deus que realiza milagres onde encontra um coração e alma sedenta para acolher Bênçãos e graças divinas como sinais visíveis da presença de Deus na caminhada. Na Segunda Leitura que refletimos na Missa, São paulo lembrando a experiência do povo de Israel em sua caminhada de quarenta anos no deserto, sugere também a nós que caminhamos em nossa caminhada quaresmal (quarenta dias de preparação para a Páscoa) que não devemos murmurar, reclamar ou simplesmente ser pessimista em relação às dificuldades previsíveis para quem caminha no “deserto da vida”. Ao nos encontrar vazios ou sedentos de comida, bebida ou necessidades básicas para a nossa alma, devemos buscar (nesta quaresma-2010 e sempre) o alimento e bebida espirituais que sacia por completo a nossa fome. A primeira carta de São Paulo aos Coríntios 10,1-12, termina com uma frase interessante: “quem está de pé tome cuidado para não cair”. Muito sugestiva em várias aspectos para a nossa vida em geral, mas gostaria de colocar o enfoque na humildade que provém do católico que se apoia no rochedo que é Cristo para continuar caminhando em pé. humildes devemos nesta quaresma conversar com Deus e deixar bem claro que em nossas limitações e humanidade precisamos estar e continuar de pé apoiados verdadeiramente em Nosso Senhor Jesus Cristo. Jesus é a nossa força, é o nosso ânimo e a nossa certeza que em de Deus Pai sempre teremos uma resposta positiva para jamais desistir ou desacreditar de nossos sonhos e projetos. Tenha uma Abençoada e inesquecível quaresma-2010!

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Dear Parish Family,

Please take a moment with me to think about the Parable of the Pearl of Great Price.

“The Kingdom of God is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it.” Matthew 13:45-46

Where does this pearl come from? A pearl begins as a particle of sand that irritates the oyster. How amazing that God brings forth beauty from the brokenness and pain of the oyster and creates a beautiful pearl, a hidden treasure. How much does God rely on the role of the human as the one who searches and finds the pearl, enjoys the beauty of it, and shares it with others?

I have been diagnosed with Breast Cancer, and as many of you know my husband and young adult children still live in Illinois. That is where I need to go to seek treatment and surround myself with the love and care of my family. I have chosen to look at this as a particle of sand, irritating and intrusive to the plans I have made to work at Good Shepherd Parish and live (eventually with my family) on Martha’s Vineyard.

My faith tells me that God is present in all of this, and God will transform the chaos of it all into a precious pearl. This transformation has already begun with the prayers, hugs, and tears that have been shared with me. I have been overwhelmed with the many “yes” responses I have received as we try to juggle and regroup the Catechesis sessions and First Communion preparations. I feel very blessed to be a part of this worshiping community.

I want you to know that I am completely committed to Good Shepherd Parish. My revised plan is to go back to Illinois, take care of this quickly, then return to Martha’s Vineyard, and resume my work here. In the meantime I will continue to do what I can from a distance – working on materials, planning the celebrations, and perfecting my Catechesis of the Good Shepherd training notes and presentations. Beth Mello will be the point of contact in my absence for anyone who finds themselves in a position to assist in some capacity. The tasks are painless, but numerous.

Please know that I am praying for you all, and I am looking forward to the time when I will once again work, worship, and grow in faith as a member of the Good Shepherd Parish.
